


Student Quick Start Guide to Connected Quizzing


Get Started

Purchase access to Connected Quizzing at AspenPublishing.com/CQ. Then, redeem your **Connected Quizzing Access Code** on your Casebook Connect bookshelf or at CasebookConnect.com/CQ.

Once you have redeemed your Access Code, click on Connected Quizzing on your bookshelf. Then, enter the **Connected Quizzing Class Code** provided by your professor in order to access your assignments.



Please note that Connected Quizzing does not come automatically as part of a Connected eBook purchase. You must purchase Connected Quizzing directly or purchase it as part of a bundle. If your professor assigns a bundle for your class, you will receive two access codes with your print shipment: one for your Connected eBook and one for Connected Quizzing.



Take Quizzes

When you have a new assignment, you will receive an email notification and a red badge will appear on the Connected Quizzing icon on your Casebook Connect bookshelf. Click on Connected Quizzing, click on a quiz, then click **Start** to begin answering questions.

Use the **Question List** to jump easily between questions and to determine which questions are answered or unanswered. You can click **Save for Later** to exit the quiz before it's due and return to it when you're ready.

View Results

After submitting your assignment, you'll receive your summary results, which include your score and time spent on the quiz. Your detailed results will also display on this page, which include your topic performance breakdown and the rationale for each question.

You may return to your results from your Assignments page. Click on the completed quiz, then **View Results**. With your detailed results, you will be able to pinpoint your strengths and weaknesses, as well as how you stack up to others in your class.
