The visually engaging, interactive study aid designed to help students review the core topics and test your student's ability to recall and correctly apply the law.


## **Getting Started**

Log in to your account on CasebookConnect.com and click on the PracticePerfect icon of a subject area on your bookshelf.




#### Classes Dashboard

You can access and manage all your classes on the Classes page. To create a new class, simply click on the "Add New Class" button. Provide the class name, semester or term, year, and an optional description, then click "Submit" to create the class. You can edit or delete your classes at any time. Share the system-generated class code with your students so they can join your PracticePerfect class.










#### Student Instructions


Go to the Classes page and click on the 'Student Instructions' button to download instructions for your students. You can then share these instructions with your students via email or any other communication method. The step-by-step instructions will guide your students through the process of purchasing PracticePerfect and using the class code to join your class.



## **Student List**

View the list of students who joined your class and perform actions like searching for a student, checking the number of quizzes they've attempted, and dropping them from the class.





## **Topic Scores**

Click on the Topic Scores tab to see the class's performance on each subtopic quiz within a topic. You can see the number of students who took a quiz and the class's average score.

### **Quiz Performance**

Click on a subtopic in the Topic Scores tab to view detailed class performance. You can use different reporting tools to assess student strengths and weaknesses.

Download a submission report to view each student's submission status and quiz score. Students can take unlimited attempts at a quiz. Your report will show each student's most recent attempt. Analyze question performance to understand the class's comprehension of that question.
